### New Vatican Instruction on the Disposal of Ashes

The Vatican recently issued new guidelines on the disposal of ashes after a cremation.

These guidelines basically state that human remains may not be scattered, divided up or kept at home but should be buried or if necessary stored in a sacred, Church-approved place.

The important point is that we treat human ashes with great respect and we are being told that keeping them in a cupboard or on a shelf at home is not appropriate and nor is dividing them up between members of the family or putting them in jewellery.

Human ashes after a cremation should ideally be buried and there are special places in each cemetery set aside for this purpose. The clergy are willing to assist and to come and offer prayers when ashes are to be buried.

It is also not considered appropriate to scatter human ashes to the four winds because this can lead to disrespect.

We have to remember that we are dealing with human remains and that we must do everything we can to give them due honour and to treat them as we would a human corpse.

Cemeteries are sacred places set aside for the burial of the dead and for the interment of ashes and it is not appropriate to dispose of human ashes elsewhere.

Each human being is a redeemed child of God and how we dispose of their earthly remains should reflect this Christian understanding.
