Eucharistic Ministers

All ministers who take Communion to the sick at home or hospital are required to sign the register in the Sacristy before or after mass. This is a safeguarding practice which must be adhered to, so please ensure this is done each and every time you make a home or hospital visit on behalf of the parish.

200 Club Membership

New members are much needed to join our parish 200 Club. £10 per month, with a 1st prize of £250; £100 for 2nd, and £50 for 3rd, 4th and 5th. Membership forms are available at the back of the church and should be returned to the presbytery. Subscriptions can be paid either by Direct Debit, or by cash, which should be delivered to the presbytery by hand. 200 Club profits are kept in reserve and are used at the discretion of the Parish Priest when a particular need arises.

Mass Intentions

The Archdiocese of Westminster have a recommended amount of £10 for a mass intention. Whilst the clergy are happy to receive any reasonable amount, the diocesan recommendation ought to be kept in mind. Please also note that intentions written on the offering envelope should be as clear as possible. If the intention cannot be understood, it will be recorded on the list as "donor's intention".

Month of the Rosary

The Church recommends to the people the praying of the Rosary, particularly during the month of October. A plenary indulgence may be gained by reciting five decades of the Rosary in church, as a family at home, or in general whenever several persons have gathered together. During this month, the Rosary is recited every weekday evening in the church from 6.45pm - all are welcome.
