Candidates for the Sacraments; Women; The Needy and Hungry of the World; Penitents and Wanderers



The Gospel for this weekend is St Mark's version of the Transfiguration, which is an addition to the other time we hear this reading on the feast of the Transfiguration itself during the summer. The Catholic understanding of this event is that it took place to prepare the disciples for the scandal of the Cross. In turn, we are presented with this Gospel today to remind us that Lent is not forever. Whilst we rightly embrace our Lenten duties and focus on the self-sacrificial love of the Father in and through the crucifixion and death of His Son, this journey through Lent will ultimately end with the glory of the resurrection of Christ and the salvation of his people.

I commend the Lenten devotions to all parishioners, which will take place in the parish this Lent - please see the opposite page for further details. Of course, making a good Lent doesn't finish with church-based activities. The usual practices of fasting, self-denial, and almsgiving should be at the heart of our endeavours without question, but Lent is also about coming to a much deeper awareness of the love and mercy of God. Thus, a deepening of prayer, together with a thorough examination of one's conscience before making a sacramental confession is essential for all of us. You will also find some light spiritual reading for Lent at the back of the church.

I also appeal to all parishioners for a greater effort in avoiding unnecessary/noisy chatter in the church before mass, especially as we enter this holy season - speak to God before mass and to each other after mass!
