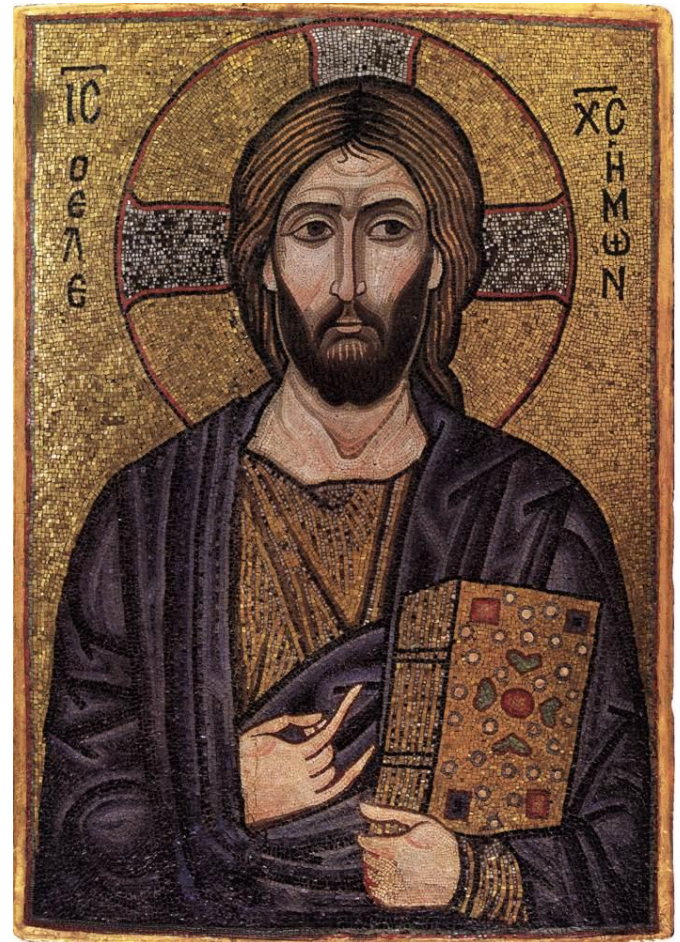

### Help required with washing the Altar Linens

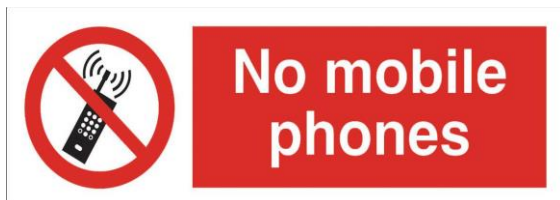

### Sea Sunday



Today is Sea Sunday, when we are invited to remember all those who live and work at sea. Seafarers are commonly recruited from poor countries where wages are low. They work in extremely difficult and often dangerous conditions and they suffer from loneliness, spiritual deprivation and even exploitation as they transport the goods we use and consume every day.

A high proportion of seafarers are Catholics and the Church owes them and other seafarers a duty of pastoral care. The Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) is the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church in Great Britain. It reaches out to seafarers that visit our ports each year, offering pastoral and practical support. The AoS is wholly dependent on voluntary donations, receiving no funding from either the Church or the government; it takes the love of Christ to seafarers in the name of the Church, recognising them as our brothers and sisters in need.
